### About us

The Global South Caucus (GSCIS) is open to members of all sections of ISA who study the global south regions, the south as a whole, relevant south societies in the north, or relations between the north and south. The Global South Caucus is a "trans-sectional" network that aims to:

- provide a channel for the sharing of research, information and ideas among scholars and practitioners of/in the various regions of the south;
- promote the ISA as the premier forum for the dissemination of cross-regional global south research;
- encourage south scholars to participate in the association's conferences (via 6s panels as well as proposals to the relevant sections) and other initiatives;
- encourage south scholars to publish in ISA journals;
- work with the ISA committees and sections to encourage graduate students to work on south issues and regions and engage in professional development activities intended to improve the employment opportunities and advancement in the profession of south-oriented scholars.

The new Global South Caucus provides a wonderful opportunity for scholars of the south to work together. If you are working in any way on thematic or area studies that can be designated as pertaining to the "south," please join the caucus.



### **Our Grant Programs**

ISA uses some of its membership and conference registration fees to fund grant programs that benefit members. There are two major programs the organization administers: Research Workshop Grants and Travel Grants. Additionally, there is a pilot program beginning in 2016 supporting financial requests for special projects not covered under existing programs: Special Project Grants.

### Research Workshop Grants

ISA's research grants provide funds to host a workshop at the Annual Convention. These grants are intended to support collaborative research that is new and innovative and involves scholars who are drawn from the global international studies community.

### Special Projects

Each year, ISA HQ receives a variety of proposals, outside the current ISA funding streams, that ask for project support and make a financial request. A one-year pilot program was approved to assemble and evaluate any such proposals.

#### **Travel Grants**

ISA runs travel grant programs for many of its conferences. The largest such program is our Annual Convention travel grants. Travel grants are available to ISA members and, typically, preferential treatment is given to graduate students, junior scholars and scholars from developing countries.

5° Postgraduate International Relations Seminar: Crises and Polarizations in the Contemporary World Order, September 9 to 11 2020

San Paolo University, San Paolo, Brazil

The Brazilian Association for International Relations has announced its 5th annual postgraduate seminar, to take place in San Paolo, Brazil.

The 5° Postgraduate IR Seminar aims to highlight the multiple crises on contemporary international dynamics, especially considering the tension between order and justice, and the discursive and material modulations that the changes in course evoke. It is considered that there is a process of political, ideological and theoretical-normative polarization emerging from this context that demands a wide debate in the field of IR about its consequences for the international order.

Applications are accepted in English, Spanish and Portuguese. Interested participants should apply by March 16, 2020.

Book: Cross-Regional Diplomacy and the Nagorno-Karabakh Conflict: The South Caucasus Meets the Global South.

GSCIS Vice Chair Jason E. Strakes is currently completing a book project under contract with Palgave Macmillan entitled *Cross-Regional Diplomacy and the Nagorno-Karabakh Conflict: The South Caucasus Meets the Global South.* 

The study applies the "hierarchy-anarchy problematique" in IR theory to the conflict between two small developing Eurasian states, Armenia and Azerbaijan, over the contested territory of Nagorno-Karabakh. It examines the relationship between Armenian and Azerbaijani elite perceptions of Western conflict management institutions dominated by the major powers such as the UN Security Council and OSCE Minsk Group Co-Chairs (U.S., Russian Federation and France), and their increasing pursuit of cross-regional diplomacy in order to garner support for their respective positions among states and international organizations in the Global South. In addition, it analyzes linkages that have formed between the Nagorno-Karabakh issue and regional conflicts in the Middle East, South Asia and South America, and their potential implications for the resolution process.
